## CONDITIONS

1. The Swim England Council reserves full powers over all Swim England Championships and Competitions.
2. The National Masters Inter-Counties Competition is managed by the Swim England Masters Working group. Responsibility for the day-to-day running of the constituent meets is the responsibility of the Regional meet organisers. Any matter not dealt with in these conditions will be decided the Swim England Masters Working group
3. The Competition shall be a team event open to all English Counties and shall be swum under Swim England Laws and Swim England Technical Rules.
4. The Competition shall be held at regional meets hosted by the Swim England Regions in 25m pools with electronic timing and shall take place as far as practicable on the third Sunday in November. The Competition shall take place as far as practical on the Second Sunday in November ideally with warm up not before 2.00 pm.

5. The results from the regional meets will be consolidated into a National Result table on an event time basis.

First place in each event will score points equal to the total number of counties participating in the National Competition, second place one less, third place two less, etc. Disqualification, no swimmer, or no team shall score nil points. Tied places will score the average of the points for the tied positions.

6. The Events included in the Competition are as follows.
  - a. Individual (one representative per county) 50m backstroke, breaststroke, butterfly, and freestyle for women and men in age groups 18 plus, 25 plus, 35 plus, 45 plus, 55 plus, and 65 plus.
  - b. Relays (one team per county) 4 x 50m medley and freestyle for women and men for age groups 72 plus, 100 plus, 140 plus, 180 plus, and mixed (two women and two men) 4 x 50m medley and freestyle for age group 220 plus and 260 plus.
7. The programme shall be swum in an order of events approved and published by the Swim England Masters Working Group. The Event numbering will remain consistent across all Regional Meets.
8. All ages shall be calculated with effect from midnight on 31 December in the year of competition. All swimmers must be 18yrs or over on the day of swim.
9. Regional meets may include other events which do not count towards the national result.
10. Each County will receive an invitation to participate from the Swim England Masters Working group during August. Counties wishing to participate shall notify their regional meet organiser no later than 30th September. The County Team Manager should submit a

provisional team sheet to the regional meet organiser one week prior to the meet. Amendments to the team sheet will be allowed on the day of the meet.

11. To be eligible to swim for a county team, each competitor shall (a) be an Swim England category 2 member of a club affiliated to that county, and (b) not have represented any other county in any swimming discipline in the calendar year.

12. The Regional Meet should be conducted using a recognised results system which interfaces directly with the electronic timing system. A copy of the Regional Meet Results must be made available to all participating counties at the end of the meet. Any errors or omissions should be raised with the Regional Meet Organiser by a County Team Manager during or immediately after the running of the Regional meet.

13. The results of each regional meet including the **names and full dates of birth** of swimmers in individual events must be forwarded to the National Results Co-ordinator no later than midnight of the Monday following the final Regional meet by the Regional Meet Organisers. Any result not submitted with the full required information will be excluded from the National Result. Regional results must be submitted in electronic format. The National Results Co-ordinator will only accept amendments to the submitted Regional results from the Regional Meet Organisers until midnight of the following Wednesday.

14. The results of each regional meet will be consolidated into a National Result by the National Results Coordinator and then forwarded to the Swim England Masters Working group for final approval. The Swim England Masters Working Group will publish the final National Result on the British Swimming website by midnight of the following Thursday.

## Guidelines & Responsibilities

National Results Co-ordinator	To accept and consolidate the Regional Meet Results into a National Result.
Swim England Masters Working Group	To manage the Competition and decide on any matters arising To send invitations to each County To approve and publish the National Result

### Team Managers' Notes

This guidance sets out the key tasks for a County Masters Team Manager when planning and organising their team for the Swim England Masters Inter-County Competition. It also contains some helpful hints and tips to try to make the task easier.

This is a national event, run annually by the Swim England Masters Working Group. It takes place in November, usually on the third weekend, but see Condition 4 above. The events are all 50m sprints with relays for men, women and mixed teams.

The programme includes both senior (18-plus) and Masters Events. Age groups are open-topped – 18-plus, 25-plus, 35- plus and so on up to 65-plus. Single-sex relay teams start at 72-plus and go on to include 100-plus, 140-plus, and 180- plus, and mixed 220-plus and 260-plus groups, reflecting the difficulty some counties have in fielding older relays.

### Selecting the team

Obtain contact details for the clubs and coaches – a good source for this data is your region's handbook and results from both local and national meets.

Approaching club coaches and swimmers can also produce potential team members. Your closed County Meet, which generally takes place in June or July, is a good source for potential team members. Have a letter/form to give to medal winners at the County Meet that asks for name, date of birth and contact details such as email, address, phone number

and their availability. Be clear in your letter/form as to when you will be making the final selection.

Aim to have as large a team as possible so that if any swimmer is unable to compete you have substitutes. Tell each swimmer what events you have entered them for, including relays. Remember to check your team members' eligibility, and ensure that you have their full date of birth, not just the year.

### Other tasks

Officials – your County will be asked to provide two officials for the inter-county meet, so ensure that you either ask those that you know or approach the person who organises officials for your county.

Team details, including who is swimming what, are sent to the regional meet organiser in advance of the meet. This is usually about two to three weeks before the event.

Cards may be sent to you for completion depending on how your region runs the meet, and it is wise to do this a day or two before in pencil should you need to make any changes.

Ensure you have kit for your team (usually a t-shirt and hat) check with your County or Masters Committee as to who supplies it.

Make sure that all your swimmers know the route to the venue. This does not always happen!

Seek help from others, such as partners, swimmers, coaches who can ensure that each swimmer is ready to swim and relay teams are sorted.

Remember it is the Team Manager's responsibility to ensure that the regional meet organisers are informed of any last minute changes, and results are noted and checked for any discrepancies, this could affect the national result!!.
