1. Course Aim

The Military and Protected Services (MaPS) Academy is designed to teach you the necessary skills to prepare you for a career within the Armed Forces and Protective Services– Army, Royal Navy, Royal Air Force, Royal Marines, Police, Fire and Ambulance services, learning from experienced staff.

Expect to gain a wide variety of skills and knowledge from a range of units related to Military and Protected Services.

All our lecturing staff have an extensive service background, combining over 100 years of experience, including extensive operational experience. Therefore, they have an excellent understanding of what recruit selection and training entails.

You will have regular engagement with the Military and Protective Services, both on site at College and at Service establishments.

2. Extra-Curricular Activities

This course lasts for approximately 36 weeks and, as with most college courses, you do not attend at weekends, although some activities require you to stay overnight during the week for expeditions, trips, etc.

There are several weeks that are given over to training, expedition, navigation, exercise, and military work experience

In addition, there will be several mandatory visits and trips off-site that you may have to either be in early, or stay overnight, to allow for travel or meet timings.

There will be occasions when you are required to attend on your non-timetabled day but advance notice will be given.

As briefed during your interview there is a requirement to pay towards the cost of the feeding during exercises.

This will total £65 for feeding during exercises (including the week-long final exercise) and expeditions.

This contribution must be paid at enrolment or by October half-term please.

Please contact the team if there are any issues with making this payment.

3. Daily Routine

You will be expected to attend, in uniform, on all timetabled days, unless told otherwise.

Spare clothing is required in addition to physical training kit and other specified kit.

SOP (Standard Operating Procedure – see below) equipment is to be brought in <u>daily.</u>

You will parade outside the MaPS building first thing every morning (unless told otherwise by staff).

There will also be parades after lunch and a final parade after lessons are complete each day (unless told otherwise by staff).

Physical training will be part of the daily routine and will generally take place after the initial parade but may be at another point during the day.

Regular inspections will be carried out throughout the duration of the course to help prepare you for a career in the services.

4. Coursework

On the course you will cover nine separate units. The course is assessed through a combination of practical assessment (a proportion of this is embedded into training exercises and routine) and coursework assignments.

The units covered are:

Level 3 Extended Diploma (Year 2) Successful completion of year 1
Unit 7 Mental and physical wellbeing
Unit 10 Understand conflict management and personal protection
Unit 12 Collaboration between uniformed services
Unit 13 Emergency planning and response in the uniformed services
Unit 14 Understand the impact of war and conflict on uniformed services
Unit 18 Outdoor and adventurous expeditions
Unit 21 Crime scene investigation
Uni 23 Volunteering in the Uniformed Services
Unit 25 Security procedures in the uniformed services

You will be given assignments to complete. These will take different forms, and each will have an assignment brief stating the criteria covered and the format to be used. You will have deadlines to adhere to for the submission of these assignments.

Assignments will need to be submitted through the Microsoft Teams application. As a student you will be able to download Office 365 (including Word, PowerPoint, Excel and Teams) onto your Laptop/Chromebook and phone.

You will create a folder on OneDrive during induction that will allow you to access your work from any device.

It is important that you keep up-to-date with assignments. If you do not, then this can lead to disciplinary action, missing activities or may affect your chances of progression.

5. Fitness Training

All fitness during the course is conducted by experienced and qualified staff and closely mirrors fitness encountered in Military and Protective Services Training and in-service training.

As part of this you will also develop your own fitness training programmes and you should work on developing fitness outside of the timetabled sessions as well.

You will undergo regular fitness assessment throughout. This will allow you to track your progress against Service entry standards.

You will take part in a **<u>daily</u>** fitness programme that is designed to be both progressive and individual, in line with industry expectations and standards. Possible activities include:

You are required to bring physical fitness clothing and footwear every day.

In addition, you should have shower kit with you daily.

During the course you will take part in various outdoor activities. You must sign or ask your parent/guardian to sign (depending on your age), the Military and Protected expected to bring every day).

6. Adventurous Training

During the course you will take part in various outdoor activities. You must sign or get your parent/guardian to sign (depending on your age), the Military and Protected Services Academy Course Form of Disclaimer.

Failure to return this form will mean you cannot participate in these sessions.

7. Kit List / Uniform – You will be required to bring the following:

Below is the list of clothing and equipment you will be expected to wear or bring to college daily.

The only items that must be purchased from a specific supplier are the MAPS polo shirts and performance T-shirt (Snowland Embroidery, follow the links below).

All other items can be purchased from the links below or can be purchased from Army Surplus, e-bay, etc.

NOTE – Military sizing is in centimetres (CM) and in the format below.

- Tops (shirt/UBACS/smock) = height then chest (e.g. 170/88 = 170cm tall, 88cm chest)
- Trousers = leg/waist/seat (e.g. 80/85/96 = 80 cm leg, 85cm waist, 96cm seat)

Please ensure that your name is written inside all clothing. You will be shown how to maintain and iron your uniform and maintain your boots.

If you have any questions or issues with the uniform or equipment, then please let us know.

In addition, we do have a limited stock of uniform that we can loan for the duration of the course if required, again please speak to us.

Remember you are representing the Services that you wish to join, something you should be proud of so uniform should be worn and maintained appropriately.


In addition, the daily SOP (Standard Operating Procedure) equipment to be brought to College every day is illustrated.

Additional **OPTIONAL** recommended clothing /equipment:


- Warm hat

8. Feeding

Generally, you will need a packed lunch or cash to purchase food on site (if you have free school meals, they can be used in the restaurant).

From time-to-time you will be off-site for the day and therefore will be required to bring packed meals for these days.

Residential students will collect theirs from the kitchen at breakfast and the remainder must ensure they bring them in from home.

You will be given prior notification of these days.

Overnight exercises and final exercises will be catered for from the food charge.

9. Attendance

With you being timetabled only four days a week, it is a very busy timetable and **attendance is critical**.

There is a college expectation of attendance above 95% (Challenge 95+). If you are below this, then further action may be taken.

The **Final Exercises** and **Look at Life Exercises** are compulsory parts of the course and students **MUST** attend those activities.
