Welcome to the Vocation Pathway

My name is Ben, and I am your Study Programme Manager this year. Throughout your time on this programme, I will work closely with you and your parents or carers, supporting you both academically and personally as you develop the skills needed for your future.

This programme is designed to provide a strong foundation for progression into further study, apprenticeships, or employment. It will help you to grow in confidence, independence, and resilience over the course of the year.

The course runs over four days each week and focuses on developing key transferable skills such as teamwork, problem solving, communication, and leadership.

As part of the programme, you will choose a specialist focus area:

- Land-based and Environment
- Animal and Equine
- Sport, Fitness and Protective Services

All of your practical learning will be based within your chosen area and delivered by specialist staff. Within these sessions, you will develop the key knowledge, skills, and behaviours required for future careers in your chosen sector. These experiences will also support your progression onto more specialist courses, apprenticeships, or employment.

Alongside your vocational learning, you will continue to develop your English and maths skills, working towards Stepping Stones, Functional Skills, or GCSE qualifications, depending on your starting point. 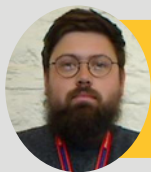

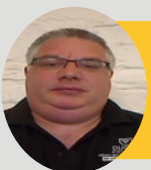

During your time in Progression Pathways, you will take part in the League of Excellence and be part of a team.

The League of Excellence

The League of Excellence recognises your effort, progress and contribution to college life.

You can be recognised for:

- Good attendance and punctuality
- Positive behaviour and attitude
- Engagement in lessons
- Making progress towards your goals

You may receive praise points, certificates and other rewards throughout the year.

Department Teams

You will also be placed in a team, made up of learners from across different courses.

Teams are named after famous or well-known Cornish individuals and represent important values such as resilience, curiosity, responsibility and equality.

As part of your team:

- Your achievements contribute to your team as well as to you as an individual
- You may take part in activities and challenges throughout the year
- You may have the opportunity to become a Team Captain

Your team will be led by **Team Guide**.



College Day

At the start of the year, everyone is provided with a timetable. You are expected to keep your timetable with you. You will have the same timetable every week, so all of your lessons will be consistent throughout the college year.

The college day and lessons start at 9:00am and poor punctuality is **not acceptable**. If you are late at the start of the day or to any of your lessons you will miss important work and will disrupt lessons.

Sanctions will be applied to learners who arrive late to college or lessons without a valid reason.

If you decide not to go to one of your lessons, sanctions will also be applied. If you are continually late or absent formal disciplinary action will be taken.

Challenge 100



If you are not in college, you must have a good reason and you must complete the college's [absence form](#) which is on our website. You can access this by scanning the QR code on your college ID card.

We operate a 'Truancy Call' system. If you are absent from college or are marked absent from a lesson, your parent/carer will receive a text message letting them know you are not at college or in lesson. They will receive a text message for every lesson you are absent.

We challenge all of our learners to attend college 100% of the time. If you know in advance that you are going to be absent from college, for example because you have a hospital appointment, you must bring evidence of your appointment.

Persistent absence will result in formal meetings with your parent/carer and Study Programme Manager and could lead to withdrawal from college.

Equipment & Uniforms

For your course, you will be required to have the following mandatory uniform:

- College-branded black polo shirt
- College-branded black sweater

For your course, you will need the following stationery and/or equipment:

- Water bottle
- Personal stationery (pencil case, pens, pencils, ruler, rubber, highlighters)
- An internet-enabled piece of technology (for example, a tablet, mobile phone or laptop)

All items must be clearly marked with names.

All students need to bring the equipment and in on their first day, where staff will complete an equipment audit.

The College has a Health and Safety Policy, which specifies that students must remove all jewellery and piercings for any practical sessions. Hoodies cannot be worn for practical lessons and hair must be tied back.

You will have also received a bespoke kit list, relevant to your chosen specialist pathway. You must ensure that you have all of this equipment with you on your first day.

Behaviour (including mobiles)

We expect all learners to be Respectful, Responsible and Ready to Learn. By working together and making positive choices, we can create a safe and supportive environment where everyone can succeed.

Mobile Phones

To support learning, mobile phones must be handed in at the start of each lesson and will be returned at the end. Phones should only be used during lessons when directed by a member of staff.
